

How it works

First-

The bone surfaces are prepared and advanced instrumentation is designed to straighten the big toe, repositioning the 3D alignment of the joint ².



An arthrodesis (fusion) of the big toe joint using Lapiplasty technology:

- Gets you back on your feet in a boot, in some cases, within 1-2 weeks¹
- Designed to straighten the big toe and reposition the 3D alignment of the big toe joint²
- ✓ Utilizes patented Lapiplasty* fixation technology to secure the joint

How does Lapiplasty Big Toe Joint Fusion™ differ from "normal" Lapiplasty ?

"The concept of Lapiplasty Big Toe Joint Fusion™ differs in that the patented plates are placed at a different joint location - the big toe joint versus the base of the metatarsal joint."

Is Lapiplasty Big Toe Joint Fusion covered by insurance and Medicare?

Yes. Insurance and Medicare typically cover bunionectomy and joint fusion procedures that utilize the Lapiplasty. System when deemed medically necessary. Your doctor's office can reach out to your provider to determine your level of coverage. This process is best left to your doctor's office.
